#### **3. Confirmation of Minutes of 2021-22 Annual General Meeting**

**It was resolved** that the minutes of the meeting held on 23<sup>rd</sup> August 2022 be confirmed as a true and correct record of the meeting.

#### **4. Presentation of Annual Report (2022-2023)**

Annual Report was taken as read and no comment made by those attending.

**5. Presentation of Annual Financial Report 2020-2021**

Board Member Barry Jordan spoke to the financial performance report, stating that our budget for the year had forecast for a loss of \$20,000. This was due to some funding being awarded for the previous year's report, but the expense was occurred in the following year. We ended up with only a small loss, but generally broke even for the year.

Barry then spoke around the heavy reliance we had on gaming machine grants which had been increasing on a yearly basis. This, as well as the climbing cost of living, was why Bowls Wellington were updating the levy system this season.

Questions were asked of the floor but none came.

**It was resolved** that the Annual Report and Financial Statements for 2022-23 be accepted.

**6. Election of President and Vice-President**

Miramar had nominated Dayle Jackson as President of Bowls Wellington. No other nominations had been received. Therefore, Dayle was re-elected unopposed.

Johnsonville had nominated Phil Todd as Vice-President of Bowls Wellington. No other nominations had been received. Therefore, Phil was re-elected unopposed.

**7. Appointment of Board Members**

On the recommendation of the Selection Panel and with no other nominations, **it was resolved** that Sue Way (Naenae) and Sharman Buckle (Lyllall Bay) be reappointed and retain their position on the board. This was unopposed.

Rodney Leitch, Barry Jordan, and Jason Puddick were appointed at the last AGM and currently served 1 year of a 2-year term.

**8. Bowls Wellington Affiliation Fee**

A motion for the change of affiliation fees was sent out to all clubs for them to discuss and vote on. Barry Jordan (Board Member) spoke to why Bowls Wellington were looking at changing the way in which we charged levies to clubs.

After a discussion on the floor around the options given to vote on for the motion, a vote took place between

Option A: Member based fee taken from database numbers extracted on 1<sup>st</sup> June 2023 which was set at \$45 per full playing member.

Or Option B: An increase of 18% for all clubs based on the current club based affiliation fee that was introduced in 2018.

The motion was put to a vote in which it was voted in favour of the change.

Option A: 34.

Option B: 11.

Abstained or not present: 6.

**The motion passed that Bowls Wellington would now adopt a member-based levy, taken from database numbers extracted on 1<sup>st</sup> June 2023, which for this season was set at \$45 per full playing member. The database numbers will subsequently be taken from the 31<sup>st</sup> March from next season on.**

## Bowls Wellington President's Report 2023/2024

Bowls Wellington Clubs can be proud of their involvement over the past season. Not only have there been many entries in our strong Interclub, entry increases in the Winter Fours, all clubs with entries in open events and several greens being repaired or totally replaced, we have now had 1-5 Year bowlers receiving three days of coaching with Wellington's High-Performance coaches. It was great to see the live streaming of our Champion of Champions finals once again.

We congratulate our Players of the Year Kaaren Guilford and Mike Carrol who were also involved at the National level with Kaaren & Dale Rayner winning the Ladies' National Fours and Mike leading the Men's Representative team to winning the Intercentre Title.

Other players competing at the National events who reached the last stages were Lisa White, Seamus Curtin, Caleb Hope, Rob Ashton, Raymond Martin, Robbie Bird. It was great to see many other Wellington club members travelling to the Nationals and other events around the country.

The Naenae men's Interclub team were beaten in the quarter Finals at the National Sevens. Johnsonville ladies gained the highest shot count in Section play but were pipped by not gaining enough wins to move on.

The Youth programme has grown in strength, overseen by Brady Amer as the Youth Engagement and Inclusively Officer working with children in both Primary and Secondary schools. This has led to a strong Secondary School competition. Many thanks to the Clubs who hosted these events. It is pleasing to see several playing in Open events, as well as National Age group events. The Clubs are beginning to include these players in their competitions and selections for Interclub teams. Jordan Keene was runner up in the Open Singles and won his first two centre titles at the Champion of Champions. Plus, we saw a strong finish by the U26 Players winning the National Under 26 Five-a-side.

The clubs supported fully the Champion of Champions events by entering their Champions in every event. Blake Signal and Ross Gillett put together an incredible draw catering for players who were in more than one event. The support from club members throughout the competition was outstanding. During the season there was definitely an increase of club members supporting their teams, so congratulations to all. This support is increasing, so well-done clubs.

The Executive members have enjoyed visiting clubs to present trophies and Bowls Wellington certificates and badges and bars. Congratulations to all winners and Clubs giving to their members a wonderful evening of celebrations.

Thank you Clubs for responding for your participation in Pennants and providing an enjoyable but highly competitive competition. The socialising at the end of each competition is an important part of this event.



This season the International Technical Officers grew in number by three so Wellington now has five umpires who enjoyed officiating at International events held in Wellington and Australia. Dick Irving was presented with his 25 Year Award for his excellent work as an Umpire.

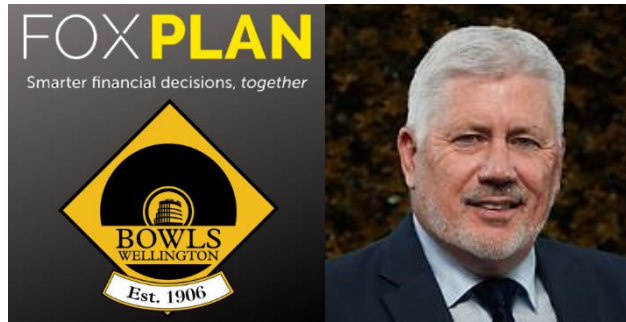

## Annual Report (Chair)

Our role as Bowls Wellington's Board is to provide the resources and strategic guidance to Blake and the team to make the sport of bowls enjoyable, entertaining and accessible to our Wellington community. In practical terms this means we use our diverse and collective experience to continually improve key areas for the organisation:

- Participation within the sport
- Communication of the game
- Support of our 24 clubs
- Leadership and governance of the organisation
- Commercial development and financial sustainability

Throughout our annual report you will see many examples from Dayle and Blake of amazing things our 24 clubs and members are doing in and around the Wellington region and at national events. In terms of the areas around governance and finance that I lead, I am pleased to report that:

- The Board is operating very well . We meet regularly, challenging Blake and each other around how we can make Bowls Wellington better. In March the Board met to discuss our strategic priorities, looking at what was set back in 2021, how we were travelling with those goals and what are the new things we need to think about.
- Our finances for FY24 have been well managed in an environment of increasingly limited grant funding opportunities but higher costs (especially around representative travel and opex). But we have had wins as well. Anticipating early the tightening grant funding environment led us to direct Blake to work on our sponsorship and corporate funding opportunities. As you will see from the financial statements this has been very successful. We are hugely grateful to all our sponsors, particularly FoxPlan, for their support. We don't take this for granted.
- Youth development has been a key priority for us for the last few years. Brady Amer's part time role was funded with the support of Nuka Ora (Sport Wellington). But Nuka Ora have told us that with their own limited resources, this funding has now ended. Despite this, our Board have decided that Brady's work is too important to end now. We

have committed to fund his work at least to the end of 2025, whilst we look for other options.

- Bowls New Zealand's census numbers show that overall our playing numbers across the region remain similar to previous years, there is though a noticeable decline in our female playing numbers. Clearly we need to do more in this area and you will see consultation work on this over the coming year as we look for ways to reverse this trend.
- The viability of our clubs continues to occupy a significant amount of effort and advice from our team. Leading these areas are challenges around council ground lease renewals, materially significant insurance costs increases and in some clubs diminishing playing member numbers. One of our strategic priorities is to support clubs by developing a resource pool of individuals skilled and experienced in this area to give clubs a hand when these issues arise – remembering though that any decisions about a clubs direction of travel always resides with the club.

Finally, a big thank you to all our volunteers. Our sport simply would not exist without your unwavering enthusiasm and immense helpfulness.

## General Managers Annual Report 2022 -23

Firstly, I would like to acknowledge and thank the Board, Staff, Clubs, and Members of Bowls Wellington for their hard work and dedication to the sport of bowls over the last twelve months. I has been exciting to see the potential grow within the region for the sport and love seeing how vibrant, friendly, and passionate our community are about bowls and our members.

Numbers participating in our tournaments seems to be increasing each year helped by the introduction of some new events this season with Bowls Wellington running 2 new youth events along with two new Over 60 events. A huge effort was once again put in by our Competitions Manager, Ross Gillett to make sure our events were well organised and able to run smoothly for our Tournament Managers. We are very fortunate to have a small team of volunteers who do a magnificent job. A big thanks to Sue Way, Ron Wood, and Steve Crowhurst who have been instrumental in our delivery of events this season. We aim to build this team of people up further to lesser the load on them, so please ask club members if they wish to help to contact me.

Our Champion of Champions weekend is still widely regarded as a showpiece event for Bowls Wellington and attracted amazing streaming numbers from the broadcast that was delivered by Bowls New Zealand. We saw some fantastic bowls over the weekend and although the draw was challenging to complete, we were able to get all finals played. The highlight of the event was to see three players under the age of 20 take out their first Bowls Wellington Title, showing the Youth Bowls program is working well.

Once again Bowls Wellington Representative program supplied great results with our Men's side claiming the National Inter-Centre title as well as a host of other trophies during the season. The work Mike Carroll and Rod Leitch have put into this program is great and we hope they continue to have the success they have had to date. Teresa Crowhurst and Sarah Cooper were new to their role this season looking after our ladies and learned a lot from a season where the ladies won the Octagonal and Wynks trophy. We look forward to their results for next season.

Our development sides were once again well looked after by Jason Puddick, Sarah Cooper, and Jim Maitland. There were some up and down performances over the season, but

highlights were winning the Hexagonal in Wellington and performing well at a new event in Auckland coming second.

Bowls Wellington continues to lead the way in our Rangatahi and Tamariki bowls programs. Brady Amer is the main reason for this success with the passion, knowledge and dedication to make things happen in this space. This year has seen another rise in young people playing our sport with almost 200 college sport players competing weekly and our “Have a Go” sessions in Schools on target to work with well over 5000 children in the calendar year.

Operationally Bowls Wellington has been running smoothly, and through the work of our finance team on the board we have been able to set up and implement a more accurate budget to work to. Funding through “Grants” took a hit this year which seems to be a trend in most organisations at a regional level. We did however pick up a Major Sponsor this year and it is great to have Steve and his FoxPlan team on board. Please reach out to Steve to find out how he can help you with his financial planning service. We also thank all our major partners who are part of the Bowls Wellington family. Their support is vital in helping us run this great sport.

Thanks to Clubs, players, umpires, greenkeepers, commercial and funding partners, sponsors, friends, supporters, and our community for the support you have given me over the season. I am excited about our opportunities for growth in our sport for the future and look forward to working for you.
